



# General Assembly

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## Resolution GA1 (2009)

### Adopted by the United Nations General Assembly at its 3rd meeting, on 20 June 2009

The General Assembly,

*Referring* to the Universal Declaration of Human rights and the Millennium Development Goals from the year 2000,

*Being fully aware of the fact* that children are the most vulnerable individuals of our society and that they need special protection,

*Inviting* the international community to take collaborative action for the proper implementation of the Millennium Development Goals,

*Recalling* the ideas of the Convention on the Rights of the Child of 1989,

*Recalling* the Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness of 2005, especially its point of donor harmonization,

1) *Encourages* the international community to identify mechanisms for fostering and monitoring progress and reassessing priorities, by

a) *Empowering* the UNDP as a coordinating body of the United Nations in order to coordinate the work of the already existing NGOs, governments and other organizations or institutions that concentrate on rights and the situation of children,

b) *Making* this body an effective instrument of the United Nations to make the work of all actors focussing on children more effective and to ensure an effective enforcement of international human rights related to children,

c) *requests* the setting up of a Commission made up of the existing bodies (UNDP, UNICEF, the Committee on the Rights of the Child) in order to monitor the aid flow to the implementing countries and to make sure that the funds are spent efficiently and the development indicators defined in point 2a) are achieved, declaring this commission as a controlling mechanism for the flow of all financial aid efforts submitted by private donors, national governments, NGOs and other financial sources with the goal to avoid work duplication and a careless waste of resources. The commission should provide a platform to NGOs to voluntarily constitute a data sharing mechanism and become a part of the solution

,which in turn will encourage the efficiency of the commission.

d) *Requesting* annual reports of each member state to this Agency in order to supervise the achievement of the goals

2) *Encourages* governments to strengthen national development plans already existing or to set up new NDPs if not existent yet to address the issues of child labour, vaccination and basic health care, access to clean water and sanitation to prevent diseases, primary and secondary education, inclusion of children in armed conflicts, children affected by HIV/ AIDS and child trafficking over the course of five years,

a) *Emphasizes* the importance of measurable, achievable and realistic output and outcome indicators as part of such plans to make measurement of the progress possible,

b) *Recommends* that national policies jeopardizing the achievement of the MDGs are revised by the national governments.

c) *expects* reforms by the national governments to ensure that there are enough systems in place to ensure transparency and accountability in the recipient countries

3) *Encourages* national governments to organise new and existing resources to ensure that the rights of each and every child in each country are promoted and respected, and to collaborate with local authorities while doing this

4) *Expects* especially developed countries, with respect to their GDP, to contribute more, especially in regard to financial aid.

5) *Demands* developing and developed countries to send experts in the areas of education and healthcare with the aim of giving technical assistance and improve the systems where it is needed

6) *Aims at* introducing child labour as the sixth focus area of the UNICEF and supporting this new area with funding,

7) *Encourages* all states to provide quality education for all children and to promote it by expansion of the schooling motivation project in the poorest countries in the world with special attention to girls enrolment in schools,

a) Also the General Assembly should focus especially on the disabled children and support them with a special treatment and education to make their lives easier.

b) There should be a special focus on girls and minorities.

c) In addition to primary education there should be health education as well as practical education.

d) To reduce child mortality women should also be educated.

8) *Strongly invites* all the member states to be engaged in strong cooperation and collaboration with the UN committees in order to provide more information in the course of dialogue and provide transparency for achieving the MDGs with regard to children rights,

9) *Reconsiders* that equal treaties and contracts are of grave importance to ensure the economic safety of families in developing countries since only working parents can take care of their children and thus don't have to rely on foreign aid.

10) *Motivates* the developed countries to establish bilateral relations with LDC in all fields of the MDGs, this cooperation shall be a result a step by step program for the development and responsiveness of partner countries.
